## THIS WEEK WE'RE LEARNING:

Jesus gives his followers a very special job!

The Great Commission  
(Matthew 28)

## MEMORY VERSE:

**I am alive forever and ever.**  
Revelation 1:18

## MOTIONS:

**I am alive** - Point both hands up  
**Forever and ever** - Twirl around

## PRAYER:

"Dear God, thank you for giving us a very special job! Help us to tell others that Jesus is alive so they can be friends with Jesus forever, too! In Jesus' name, amen."

## FAMILY ACTIVITIES:

### RED LIGHT, GREEN LIGHT:

Play Red Light, Green Light as a family. One person stands across from everyone else on the other side of the room. This person is the caller. When the caller says "Green Light" everyone walks, runs, hops (your choice!) toward them. When the caller say "Red Light" everyone has to freeze.

Play several rounds, taking turns with who is the caller.

**WHAT YOU SAY:** Do you know what it means when we get a green light when we're driving the car? It means we get to go! Jesus gave His friends the "Green Light" telling them to GO and make disciples in the whole world! We get to help do that too because we can tell others that Jesus is alive!

### TELL THE WORLD

**What You Need:** Paper or attached template, decorating supplies

Explain to your child that we get to share the Good News that Jesus is alive with everybody! Spend some time making megaphones with the attached template or a sheet of paper. Encourage your child to color or decorate their megaphone and then tape it together. Go in the yard or dance around the house saying, "I have good news! Jesus is alive!"

# Shout Megaphone

1. Print template onto cardstock and cut out, or trace onto a piece of cardboard. An empty cereal box turned inside-out would work well
2. Color/paint/decorate your megaphone.
3. Tape or staple your megaphone together.
